NATIONAL CONSTITUTION CENTER HONORS GEORGE W. BUSH AND LAURA BUSH DURING 30TH ANNUAL LIBERTY MEDAL CEREMONY

Vice President Joe Biden to present the medal and Valley Forge Military Academy and College Herald Trumpeters to perform

Philadelphia, PA (November 11, 2018) – Tonight at 5 p.m., Sunday, November 11, the National Constitution Center will honor President George W. Bush and former first lady Mrs. Laura Bush during the 2018 Liberty Medal Ceremony, in recognition of their post-presidency work with veterans and their families. Vice President Joe Biden, Chair of the National Constitution Center's Board of Trustees, will bestow the annual Liberty Medal award. Valley Forge Military Academy and College Herald Trumpeters will perform. Sergeant First Class Michael "Rod" Rodriguez, retired United States Army Special Forces Green Beret, and Sergeant Leslie Zimmerman, United States Army Combat Medic, will deliver a special tribute in honor of the Bush Institute's Military Service Initiative.

The pre-show event will begin with an introduction from National Constitution Center Executive Vice President and COO Vince Stango, followed by remarks from Independence National Historical Park Superintendent Cynthia MacLeod; the presentation of colors by the Pennsylvania Air National Guard, 11th Attack Wing; and singing of the National Anthem by a soloist from the United States Army.

The Liberty Medal Ceremony will be introduced and hosted by National Constitution Center President and CEO Jeffrey Rosen. It will include remarks by University of Pennsylvania President Amy Gutmann, United States Army Sergeant First Class Michael "Rod" Rodriguez, United States Army Sergeant Leslie Zimmerman, National Constitution Center Board of Trustees Chair Vice President Joe Biden, and honorees President George W. Bush and Mrs. Laura Bush.

Vice President Joe Biden, accompanied by National Constitution Center Executive Committee Chairman Doug DeVos and National Constitution Center President and CEO Jeffrey Rosen, will present President George W. Bush and Mrs. Laura Bush with the 2018 Liberty Medal. The ceremony will conclude with remarks from Mrs. Laura Bush and President George W. Bush.
